

Levels of sport fishing interest in Teal and Lost Land lakes (combined) for select species among Wisconsin DNR visioning session participants on June 3, 2006 (N=19) and WDNR online survey respondents in April of 2018 (N=59). Decimal fractions in the 2006 data result from averaging the responses for Teal and Lost Land lakes. In the 2006 visioning session, bluegill were of too little interest to participants to include in preference polling. In the 2018 online survey, non-response was not factored into Relative Importance Index calculations, unlike in 2006 when a purposeful vote of “No Interest” reflected either zero interest in angling for a particular species or actual antagonism toward that species.
